

Annual Report Of Activities Carried Out By Bilu Rural Community Uganda During The 2022-2023 Budget Year Involving 7 SDG's Areas

This is the Annual report for activities carried out by **BILU RURAL COMMUNITY DEVELPOMENT UGANDA**

Agriculture

1. We have continued with the development of a rainwater harvesting



system and building a 500 cubic meter reservoir. To be used by Nasala Community in Lawmata Subcounty Kiboga District.

2. We have started on the beekeeping development project





which is a joint activity between

parents and school children, the first pilot in a school named Bukubu Primary School, Nsala Village Rwamata Sub county, Kiboga District.

Education

1. **'Feel Free'**, a project under BILU that is empowering teenagers in the primary schools has now started its activities in 13 (Thirteen) primary school.

These activities are:



a. Supply of reusable and affordable sanitary pads that are made by the community. These sanitary pads are supplied to school attending girles primary school kids. The girls are educated on how to use the sanitary pads. The schools supplied it are listed here below: Bamsuta, Kiboga progressive,

Yang Crains ,St. Andrews ,Kiboga birth, Kiboga DAS, Bokovo, St.Paul,

Chrinda consultant, in addition 4 schools in Hoima district: Busuruga primary, Kabale primary, Chparony, Niyamasoga.

b. We carried out HPV education and vaccination in 95 primary schools. We have increased the percentage of HPV vaccinated girls in the primary schools from 14% to 46% IN Kiboga District.



c. We have provided sexual education for safe sex and awareness and avoidance of early pregnancies in school attending children and HIV morbidity.



2. Beekeeping project

We entered a joint venture with Kiboga Bee Keeping Corporative Society and together, we are teaching the children practices and practices of bee keeping. The Corporative Society is helping purifying the honey for the community. See picture in Agriculture section

We are teaching the communities the advantages of bee keeping for both health, agriculture and income generation. Bee keeping products health benefits which are very nutritive to the children.

We are helping the community to sell their bee keeping products which include, honey, bee wax, propolis, and queen's food.

3. We have started running cheeses making classes in a total of 7 (seven) schools. These schools are Bamsuta, Kiboga progressive, Yang Crayins St. Andrews, Kiboga DAS, Bokovo,, Chrinda consultant.

A total number of 380 (three hundred and eighty) elementary school children are currently members of this project. Om March 2023 the first Kiboga Cheese tournament toke places with 64 participants.





4. We had activities in 10 schools in Kiboga District between the 10 of August up to the 22 of August and we named it the 10 days of creativity. These ten days of creative activity included games drawing, storytelling, team plays and other activities in the schools.



The list of schools are hereunder: Bamsuta, Kiboga progresive, Yang Crayins St. Andrews, Kiboga DAS, Bokovo,, Chrinda consultant. St paul, Kiboga birth.

5. Educational scholarship for kids with Juvenil Diabetes and SCD Sickle-cell disease get support to complete secondary education up to now 4 scholarships were distributed.



Health

1. We carried out survey and outreaches into the different communities of Kiboga District. We offered health services of checking for High Blood Pressure, Diabetes into those communities. A total of 6,000 people were surveyed in the following Sub countis HC: MWEZI HCII, ST.JAMES MASILIBA C.O.U HC II, BUKOMERO HCIV, KATWE HC III, KATALAMA HC III, MUYENJE HCII,Ntwetwe HC IV Lawamata town council HCII Katwe HCIII Nyamilinga HCII Nasala HCII If after the survey a person is found suffering from the above disease, we would refer the patient to the nearby health center to be handled.

We had in the past educated the medical staff in the different health centers how to handle HBP and diabetes disease

2. We provided treatment services by supporting the health Centre 5, 4 and 3 in Kiboga District and Kiboga Main Hospital. We were mainly

offering treatment of HBP and Diabetes Disease. Approximately a total of 2950 patients were worked on.

- 3. During the financial year 22-23, we increased the HPV vaccination percentage from 14% to 46% in Kiboga district.
- 4. We established a Sickle Cell Anemia clinic for the first time, it was opened on August 2022 at Kiboga District Hospital. Up today 115 patients have joined it, receiving a free follow up and treatment.



5. We are currently doing a survey on enrichment of school meals for school going children. We have currently employed a nutritionist and she has begun on the survey.



We are expecting the Enrichment of school meals activity to will begin activity in the second half of 2024 as we will have concluded our survey.



The arrival of 7 volunteer doctors who, in addition to serving the community, worked at the district hospital of Kiboga treating and

raising awareness on the Non Communicable Diseases in the communities of Kiboga.

7. We held two (2) Medical camps in collaboration with Rotary Club of Kiboga. The main emphasis of the camp was to promote awareness, survey and screen for Non Communicable Diseases which included cervical cancer, HBP and awareness in Kiboga. The camps were held in the kiboga town council on 15 December 2022 the second one was done on 27 August during Rotary cancer run
